

ANTI-LITTER (FREEPORT) RULES

S.I. 9/1968

(SECTION 6)*[Commencement 25th January, 1968]*

1. (1) These Rules may be cited as the Anti-Litter (Freeport) Rules. Citation and application.
- (2) These Rules shall apply within the Port Area.
2. In these Rules, unless the context otherwise requires Interpretation.

“public place” includes any road, and any street, lane, passage, square, recreation area, inland waterway or other place to which the public have access for the time being within the Port Area.
3. (1) No person shall place or throw down and leave in any public place any rubbish save in a container provided by or under the authority of the Port Authority for the reception of rubbish. Prevention of the deposit of rubbish.
- (2) No person shall sweep or otherwise remove into any public place from a shop, house, factory, warehouse or other premises abutting thereon any rubbish with the intention to leave the same in such public a place otherwise than in a container provided by or under the authority of the Port Authority for the reception of rubbish.

SEA BATHING RULESG.N. 251/1938
G.N. 11/1953**(SECTION 7 (1))***[Commencement 17th September, 1938]*

1. These Rules may be cited as the Sea Bathing Rules. Citation.
2. Sea bathing shall be permitted at or from any public wharf or place of public resort except — Prohibition of bathing.
 - (a) at or from the wharf known as Rawson Square;

(b) at or from the northern extremity of the continuation of Hall's Lane which runs along the eastern boundary of the Eastern Police Station; and

(c) at or from the wharf known as Prince George's Wharf.

Times of bathing.

3. Sea bathing shall be permitted at or from the public property between the western boundary of the British Colonial Hotel and Nassau Street between the hours of 9 a.m. and 12 noon and 4 p.m. and 6 p.m. only.

All bathers to be properly attired.

4. All bathers shall be properly attired to the satisfaction of the Commissioner of Police.
