IMPORT CONTROL REGULATIONS (CHICKEN) ORDER, 1991

(SECTION 3)

[Commencement 4th December, 1991]

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as the Import Control Regulations (Chicken) Order, 1991.

Control of importation of chicken.

2. (1) No person shall import any chicken (fowl) and chicken parts into The Bahamas without a licence issued by the Minister:

S.I. 112/1991.

Provided that the foregoing shall not apply to a person who on his arrival in The Bahamas has within his baggage or private effects chicken (fowl) or chicken parts not exceeding fifty pounds in the aggregate, for use other than for commercial purposes.

(2) A licence referred to in subparagraph (1) shall be subject to such terms and conditions as the Minister may specify therein.

Penalties for contravention.

3. Any person who fails to comply with paragraph 2(1) shall be guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine of two hundred and fifty dollars or to imprisonment for a term of six months or to both such fine and imprisonment.

Title.

S.I. 35/1993.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Import Control (Foods, Plants and Animals) Regulations, 1993.

Interpretation.
S.I. 35/1993.

2. In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires —

“animal” has the meaning assigned to it by the Animal Contagious Diseases Act;

“food” has the meaning assigned to it by the Food Act;

“plant” has the meaning assigned to it by the Plants Protection Act.
