MINISTRY OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS (CONSULAR SERVICES) (FEES) REGULATIONS

(SECTION 13)

[Commencement 11th May, 2015]

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Ministry of Foreign Affairs (Consular Services) (Fees) Regulations. Citation.
- 2. In these Regulations, “Children’s Passport”, “Frequent Traveller’s Passport” and “Regular Passport”, respectively have the same meanings as in the Passport Rules. Interpretation.
- 3. The fees to be charged for the consular services rendered by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs shall be as specified in the Schedule. Fees for consular services.
- 4. The Ministry of Foreign Affairs (Consular Services) (Fees) Rules are repealed. Repeal.

 7. Obtaining a legalization or other certification from another authority upon any document in addition to costs, if any 50.00
 8. Supplying certified copies of documents forming part of the records of the courts of The Bahamas, for every page with a minimum charge of \$5.00..... 10.00
 9. Preparing any certificate, declaration or document not otherwise provided for:
 - (a) in standard form, per copy 25.00
 - (b) not in standard form, per 100 words or less —
 - (i) in English 25.00
 - (ii) in any other language plus cost if any 50.00
 10. Preparing or signing, or both, a declaration of existence except in connection with pay or pensions payable by a department of the Government of The Bahamas 50.00
 11. To process an application for a work permit and to verify and certify the presence of the applicant outside The Bahamas 150.00
 12. To process an application for a residence permit by the holder of a work permit and to certify and verify the presence of the applicant outside The Bahamas 150.00
 13. Prepare and apostille/legalisation of documents:

- (c) Rush (wait while prepared) requests for documents..... 300.00
14. Issuing a Bahamian visa card for visiting The Bahamas 50.00

19. Making or forwarding, or both, a request or communication to any authority of a foreign state or Commonwealth country. Commonwealth Colony protectorate, Protected state or trust territory, for the issue or renewal of a passport or other travel document or document of identity or for the grant of a visa or entry permit in addition to costs, if any. 100.00

- (b) a maximum in respect of each ship where crews or parts of crews transfer between Bahamian ships of. 20.00
except where an apprentice—
- (i) is transferred whilst overseas from one ship to another; or

- (ii) having come to the end of his indentures,
signs on as a seaman in addition to fee 58
where applicable

65. Taking custody of a ship's papers, making any
necessary endorsements thereon, and giving the

furnishing the copy which must be made accessible to
